School: Collegiate

Year: Senior

Position: Goalkeeper

She was first-team all-district and all-region for the Central Region runner-up Raiders.

Year: Junior

Position: Midfield

She was the Colonial District player of the year and was co-region player of the year. She made the All-Metro team all four years: second team as a freshman and first-team the past three years.

Position: Midfield

The skinny: Came off an All-Metro basketball season and repeated as a first-team All-Metro pick in soccer. She shared Dominion District player of the year honors with Erin Layne after helping the Titans reach the region semifinals with 16 goals and eight assists. Was first-team all-region and has committed to play soccer at UR.
