Year: Senior

Scoring average : Shot 68-73 to win second Prep League title.

The skinny: St. Christopher's plays golf in the spring, but Chalkley's stature among junior golfers in the area warrants his selection as the first private school player to make All-Metro.

After a summer in which he won the RGA Junior and an AJGA (national level) tournament and had strong showings in men's events, he signed a scholarship offer to Virginia Tech. He won the Prep League title as a freshman and last year and is the favorite to repeat this spring.

School: Cosby

Year: Junior

18 holes: 75.3

The skinny: Highlighted a banner season with his selection as the Dominion District and Central Region player of the year. He was third in the district tournament, tied for second at the region event and qualified for the state tournament for the second time. The team captain, he was medalist in eight of 12 matches. His low round was a 69 at Spring Creek in Gordonsville.

The skinny: During the summer, he finished second to Chalkley in the RGA Junior, then was medalist in the high school seasonopening Skyhawk Invitational. Foutz was the Capital District player of the year and won the district tournament medal with a 3-under 69. He was fifth in the region tourney and was the No. 3 individual qualifier for the state tournament.

School: Deep Run

Year: Sophomore

18 holes: 74.8

The skinny: Repeats as a first-team All-Metro selection. He was the most consistent of Deep Run's talented group of players and was the only player to shoot a subpar round in the Central Region tournament. His 1-under 70 the second day vaulted him to the individual title by a stroke over teammate Jason Schumacher and Cosby's Kevin Clarke. He was Deep Run's medalist at the VSGA Invitational, the district mini-tournament and the state tournament.
